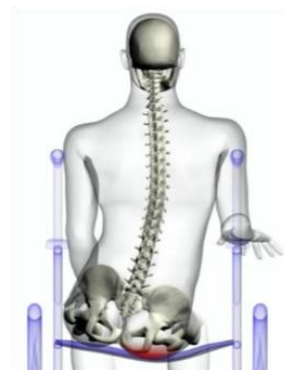
Pressure Management Masterclass
